Overview: Engage in research on the topic of Franklin D. Roosevelt

Estimated Time: 15 minutes

Explanation of Activity/Assignment: Use the online resource Britannica School to learn more about Franklin D. Roosevelt. When you go to the home page of Britannica School simply type in Franklin Roosevelt in the search bar. After your search results come up and the word Franklin Roosevelt is at the top, click on the word Franklin Roosevelt (highlighted in blue). You

can go back and forth between article reading level tabs 1 and 2. (it all depends on your own reading level). Enjoy reading!
